New secondhand smoke prevention rules have been enacted.

Effective April 1, 2020, the revised Health Promotion Law will be fully enforced.

The Health Promotion Law was partially amended in 2018. To curb secondhand smoke, ban on indoor smoking takes effect in April 2020 at all places used by a large number of people, unless otherwise specified.

Basic concept of the revised Health Promotion Law

- No.1 Eliminate unwanted secondhand smoke
- No.2 Special attention to children and patients who are most likely affected by secondhand smoke
- No.3 Different countermeasures against smoking for different types and locations of facilities

Points of the revised Health Promotion Law

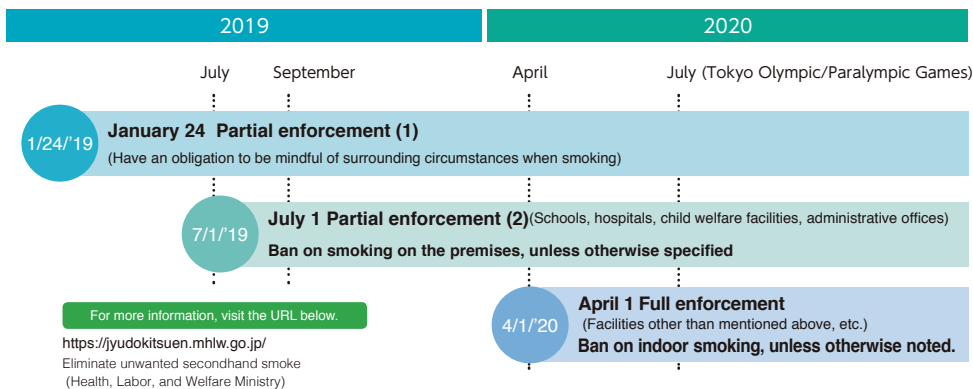
● Applicable to all people

- Absolutely no smoking at designated "No Smoking" areas
- Ban on posting signs with misleading messages and/or vandalism thereof

● Facilities: Different countermeasures for different facilities

- Indoor smoking is banned at most facilities unless otherwise specified
- Special smoking rooms equipped with all required features must be installed to allow indoor smoking
- Off-limits to people underage, including employees
- All designated smoking rooms must be marked by a sign
- Ashtrays or other smoking fixtures & apparatus should not be installed in the designated smoking area
- Take measures to protect employees from secondhand smoke

Type of facilities and governing rules

● Schools, child welfare facilities, hospitals & clinics, administrative offices (Type 1 facilities)

- Effective July 1, 2019 Ban on smoking on the premises
- However, with permission of the facility manager, an open-air smoking area equipped with necessary secondhand smoke protective measures can be set up

● Eating & drinking establishments, offices, businesses, factories, hotels, inns, trains/ships, and all other facilities (Type 2 facilities)

- Effective April 1, 2020 Ban on indoor smoking, unless otherwise specified.
- However, with permission of the facility manager, designated smoking rooms as well as those exclusively for heated tobaccos can be installed provided that these rooms meet the requirements of preventing smoke escaping to other parts of the building

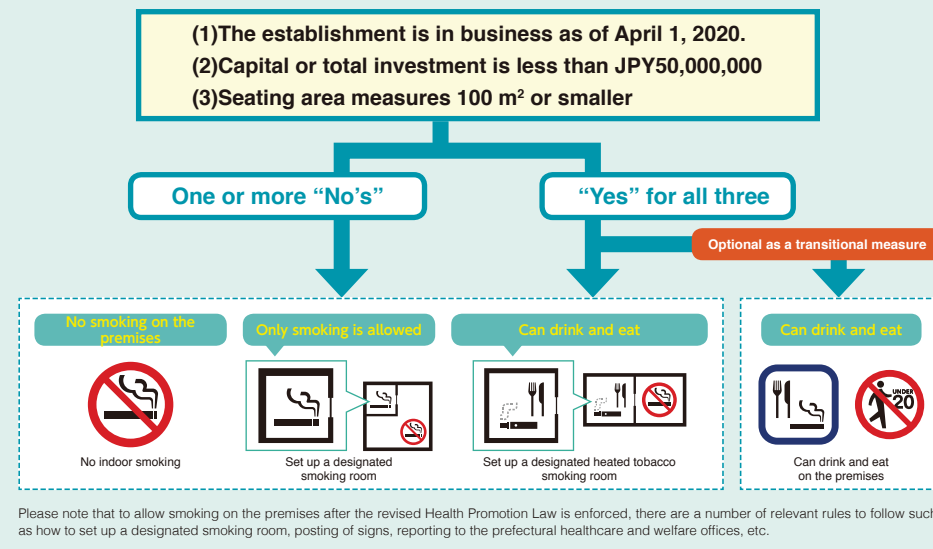
< Technical requirements of building a designated smoking room >

- (1) Air velocity is over 0.2m/s measured at the Entrance/Exit to the smoking room
- (2) The smoking room has a ceiling and is partitioned by walls.
- (3) Ventilation system is in place for tobacco/cigarette smoke to be exhausted outdoors



Transitional measure to be applied for eating and drinking establishments

As a transitional measure, these establishments can allow indoor smoking by meeting all three requirements listed below.



● Buses, taxis, airplanes, etc.

- Effective April 1, 2020, ban on smoking inside the vehicle

● Outdoors, homes, etc. (To be enforced as of April 1, 2020)

- Pay special attention not to smoke where people are around
- Make sure there are no children or sick people around before start smoking
